As a Voter, You Have Rights

As a voter, you have the right to:

- Cast your ballot free from interference in a private and secret manner unless assistance is requested;
- View written instructions on how to obtain a ballot for voting, how to vote, and prepare the ballot for deposit in the ballot box;
- Ask for and receive further instructions from election judges concerning the manner of voting;
- View a sample ballot in the polling place before voting;
- Cast a vote if you are in line before the polls are closed at 7:00 PM;
- Ask to have the election judges or person of your choice assist you in voting if you cannot read, are blind, or have any other physical disability and cannot vote your ballot; request curbside voting, or a more accessible polling location if needed;
- Receive another ballot if your ballot is accidentally spoiled or you make an error;
- Vote on statewide candidates and issues and federal candidates by provisional ballot if the election judges or the election authority cannot determine your registration status;
- Vote by absentee ballot when permitted by law; and
- File a grievance with the Secretary of State's office if your rights under the Help America Vote Act, Title III, have been violated.

Your Vote is Your Voice!

Registering to vote during a period of houselessness can be an intimidating task. However, KCEB wants to make this process as easy as possible. Here are a few suggestions for getting or staying registered when you have no current address:

- 1. Many shelters will allow their address to be used on an un-homed voter's registration. Just ask!
- 2. Register to vote at a state building, election office, or public library. List your address as the shelter or location which has agreed to accept mail on your behalf.
- 3. If you do not currently possess an ID, you may register using the MO Voter Registration Postcard application, which does NOT require ID to be shown *at the time of registration. These are available at all KC Public Libraries and the KCEB Election Office.
 - *A valid ID will need to be obtained before you will be able to vote.

- 4. Be sure to collect your Voter

 Notification Card from the location at which you are receiving mail. This card is sent out one week before each election and will provide you with the name and address of your polling place.
- 5. While it is encouraged that you vote at your designated polling location found on your Election Notification Card as it will be within close proximity to the address you used to register, all KCEB polls are considered "Central Polls".

What this means is that if you are unable to find transportation to your designated poll, you are able to vote at any poll in KCEB's jurisdiction using the Ballot Marking Device. A standard preprinted paper ballot will only be available at your designated poll.

make your selections, and your voted ballot
is printed out. You then place your voted
ballot into the ballot box.

Types of Valid Voter ID

Accepted photo IDs:

- MO Driver's License;
- MO Non-driver's License;
- Out of State Driver's License;
- Passport ID Card;
- Passport;
- Military/Government ID; or
- ID from a Missouri University, College, or Vocational or Technical School.

Accepted Non-photo IDs:

- Utility Bill;
- Government Check;
- Payroll Check;
- Bank Statement; or
- Any other government document that contains the name and address of the voter.

If you do not have an acceptable form of ID you may apply with the Missouri Secretary of State's office to receive one (1) free non-driver's license for voting purposes.
